## President's Cup Wrap-up

On September 26th, and 27th CCC renewed the competition of its Presidents Cup Matches. 36 hearty men and women competed on teams captained by Mike Heib (White Team) and Matt Jaynes (Blue Team). On Saturday the weather was magnificent as the teams faced off for their Saturday matches, 9 holes of foursomes (2 Person Best-Ball) and 9 holes of alternate shot. The golf course was in outstanding condition thanks to Superintendent Dennis Fitzwater, and our incredible greens staff.

The Saturday matches proved to be a runaway on the part of Matt Jaynes Blue Team, which opened up a nearly insurmountable 12 points to 6 points advantage after the Saturday Competition. The Blue Team gloated that "it was over" while the White Team sought out consolation and inspiration. Hoisting a martini at dinner that evening White Team Captain Mike Heib stated "I have a good feeling about tomorrow". I believe these same words were spoken by Ben Crenshaw on the eve of an incredible comeback by Team USA in the Ryder Cup matches facing nearly insurmountable odds.

Sunday dawned cool and foreboding as cloudy skies began to spit some rain. Several Blue Team members were overheard suggesting that the day be cancelled and the event be declared a Blue Team victory. The White Team took this as inspiration as they donned their raingear and headed out. The outcome would be determined as it should be, on the course. Sunday's matches consisted of 9 holes of Captain and Mate followed by 16 Individual Matches, which would determine the Champions. One point is earned for a victory and ½ point for a tie or halve.

The weather quickly turned foul and you could no longer tell one team from the other. Blue and White was replaced with a rainbow of raingear and umbrellas. Noah was seen assembling animals near the back of the 13th green. Play went on in spite of the conditions. 36 people played through and completed their rounds (without a singular complaint about the conditions). As the last few matches were played out it became evident that the White Team now called team Mud had overcome the 6 point deficit and was clinging to a slim 1 point lead. The final match and the outcome was to be determined at Hole 15. The problem was that the rest of the competitors were now battling the infamous 19th hole at CCC. No one went out to watch the final putts, the outcome in the balance everyone waited with their favorite beverage for the results to be finalized. A discussion ensued about how a tie would be broken. An 18 hole playoff was suggested and quickly dismissed. Captain Heib uttered the now famous words "in the event of a tie the Head Professional wins". The Keating room was filled with cheers and boos dependent upon your team colors. Withered and shriveled hands and the smell of wet shoes filled the the Keating Room. The scorecard arrives and lo and behold the Matches are declared a tie.

A trophy is revealed, and it is declared that the success of this event is worthy of establishing a traditional CCC competition. The semi-annual (Spring and Fall) matches will now and forever be known as the Heib Cup Matches in recognition of the dedicated service our Head PGA Professional has provided to all of us a CCC members. Future competitions are open to ALL CCC members and you are encouraged to participate in what was and will be a traditional fun filled event. Thanks to all who participated.
