

CORNING COUNTRY CLUB

POLICIES

(As Revised 2/14/08)

The appropriate committee must submit complaints or suggestions regarding any phase of the Club's operation in writing to insure action.

DRESS CODE FOR MEMBERS AND GUESTS

1. Appropriate attire must be worn at all times on the golf course and in the Clubhouse. Examples of attire that are not acceptable include bathing attire and swim trunks, cut offs or ragged pants of any length, tennis shorts, miniskirts, halter tops, tank tops, tee shirts, numerical jerseys or non collared shirts for men.
2. Denim jeans are permitted in the Keating (Grill) Room year round however, not allowed on the Golf Course.
3. Walking shorts will be no shorter than 6" above the knees.
4. Sport coats or suit coats are requested dress on Saturday evenings in the Steuben Dining Room and at Sunday Brunches.
5. No metal spikes are allowed on the Golf Course or in the Clubhouse.
6. This dress code applies to members, dependents and guests of all ages; and it is incumbent upon a member to advise his or her guest(s) of this code. The dress code in the clubhouse for outside functions is left to the discretion of the Club Management.
7. The Pro Shop personnel, the Manager and the members of the Board of Directors shall enforce this dress code.
8. Failure to comply with this policy will result in denial of access to the golf course or clubhouse.
9. Refusal by the member, dependent or guest to comply with this directive will lead to appropriate Board action being taken.

FINANCIAL POLICIES

1. A person will pay the initiation fee for the type of membership requested. When a person changes to a type of membership at a higher initiation fee, with the exception of members under the age of 40 transferring to the 40 and over membership, the difference in fee becomes due immediately.
2. A new member joining the Club is responsible to pay in full the designated initiation fee for his particular class of membership. A check for this amount must accompany the application for membership.
3. If a member goes to a type of membership at a lower initiation fee, no refund will be paid.
4. There is a minimum monthly food assessment of \$50 for all family memberships and \$25 for all single memberships. Exceptions to the monthly minimum are Dual Membership and Non-Res Golf Memberships. The member, either in cash or charge, may spend this minimum billing any time within the given calendar month. The member also has the option of paying their food minimum based on their current membership classification on a one time basis beginning on February 1, of the current year for the clubs fiscal year ending on January 31. Their account will be debited each time they spend qualifying expenditures until such time they have used up the annual minimum fee. Once that annual minimum has been spent, charges will begin to appear on their monthly bill. New members who join the club after the February 1 of a given year will be offered the same option on the basis the number of months left in the fiscal year. If a member resigns, no reimbursements for prepaid food minimums will be granted. Only food charged to or paid for through an individual's account can be applied toward the monthly food minimum. Meals paid for through a business, organization, or special function will not apply.
5. Each Family Golf membership will receive two free lockers. Each additional locker for other members of the family are available at a cost determined annually.
6. Delinquent Account Notification Policy:
 - a.) Business Office calls member after 15 days delinquent and prior to next Board meeting.

b.) If NO resolution, a letter from the General Manager will be written notifying delinquent member that at 45 days delinquent all privileges including – charging to their account – use of the course and clubhouse will be suspended until payment in full is received.

c.) After 90 days– the members name will be posted in the front lobby of the clubhouse and the Board will send a letter to the delinquent member notifying them that their account is going to collections.

7. When a member is suspended for non-payment of charges due the Club, the suspended member and his family cannot use the Club facilities or participate in any functions sanctioned by the Club until the indebtedness has been paid in full.
8. When it becomes necessary to turn a suspended or resigned member over to a Collection Agency or Attorney for non-payment, the cost of, including reasonable attorney fees and costs, will be incurred by the suspended member.
9. When a member dies, the membership is transferred to his/her spouse/companion and dues are waived for twelve (12) months, starting the month after the death.
10. A child or stepchild of a member may apply for all classes of membership without payment of an initiation fee provided his/her parent is, and has been, a member for the previous (5) years. This membership may be transferred to the name of his/her spouse.
11. All Corning Country Club income transactions (i.e. cart rental fees, greens fees, driving range fees) processed through the Pro Shop, will be handled on a “Charge Only” basis. If a member is concerned regarding the charge to his/her monthly statement, the cash from guests may be taken directly to the bar in the Clubhouse. The member can pay the receipt at the bar or Business Office and the payment will immediately be credited to his/her account.
12. The Manager and Golf Pro can accept charging between Corning and Reciprocal Clubs and member players of non-reciprocal, private country clubs. Charging privileges apply only after our Club Pro or Management verifies with their home Club that they are members in good standing. If cash is paid to the Business Office or Clubhouse, a cash receipt needs to be presented to the Pro Shop.

13. All Guest fees associated with the golf course or pool activities will be charged to the member.
14. There will be a cancellation fee for special events. Any member canceling a reservation within 48 hours of the scheduled function will be charged a fee of 50% of the package charge. This fee may be waived in cases of extreme emergency. Events this charge will apply to are special functions with a set fee, i.e., New Year's Eve Party, Anniversary Dinner/Dance, Member/Guest, Best Ball, Member/Member and monthly theme parties.
15. Use of Corning Country Club charge accounts at other businesses by Corning Country Club employees or members, for personal use, is not permitted.
16. Personal use of Corning Country Club employees during working hours is not permitted.

HOUSE RULES

1. There is no limitation on a member bringing guests for food and beverage service.
2. Members in good standing may use their account to charge for any Club service, including gratuities. Members shall be billed monthly for these charges.
3. Members shall be charged for any unusual damage or breakage caused by themselves or their guests and shall be responsible for all debts incurred by their guests.
4. Members may arrange for private parties through our Food & Beverage Manager and/or Manager. The member booking the party assumes full responsibility for actual payment of bill.
5. Children under 16 years of age:
 - a. Are not allowed to loiter in the locker room areas of the Clubhouse.
 - b. Must be accompanied by an adult in the bar and food service areas in the Clubhouse. Small children must be restrained from action that may cause annoyance to other Club members in the Grill and Dining rooms.
 - c. Are not allowed to sit at the Bar.
 - d. Are not allowed to use the Exercise Facility.
 - e. These policies will be strictly enforced because of safety and legal issues.
6. Dogs shall not be allowed in the Clubhouse and are not permitted to run free upon any of the Club grounds.
7. The sale of intoxicating beverages shall cease, in accordance with the law, at 1:00 AM daily. The Clubhouse shall be closed by 2:00 AM daily without exception. This means that members and their guests must actually depart prior to this time. Bartenders are not permitted to make any exceptions.
8. Pursuant to New York State Law, the Club and its Staff are not permitted to serve intoxicated members or guests.
9. Absolutely no food or beverages are allowed to be brought into the Clubhouse or onto the grounds from outside unless prior arrangements have been made by the General Manager.

10. Checks of members who are in good standing will be cashed, provided they are made out to cash and not to the Club, as long as funds are available without causing Club funds to run short. Only one check per member per day can be cashed. The maximum sum of any check is limited to \$100. Personal checks will not be held in the Club safe beyond one deposit day. Postdating checks is not permitted. A fee of \$25 will be charged for all returned checks.
11. The Club newsletter shall not include commercial advertising of any nature for anyone.
12. Golf clubs, bags and handcarts are not to be stored in locker rooms or lockers.
13. Drinking glasses, tableware and silver are not to be taken outside the Clubhouse, with the exception being the deck or patio areas. Upon request, food and beverage service will be provided, using unbreakable materials, for consumption on the course.
14. The Corning Country Club does not participate, endorse or allow any memorial plaque either inside or outside the Clubhouse that are not already in place with the exception of the current Tee Sign Program.
15. Tee Sign Program: Cost of the original sign is \$300 with no additional charge for the next three years. Cost for maintenance of signs thereafter is \$100 for three years. Members may have the option to \$33/ year or the entire \$100.
16. The Club, between the 1st and the 20th of the month, will offer "Take Out Food". No telephone orders will be accepted. Take outs must be ordered on the premises.
17. The Corning Country Club is a "Smoke-Free" Establishment. There will be NO SMOKING allowed anywhere inside the building.
18. Designated smoking areas for members and employees are:
 - a. Members – Lower patio outside Keating Grill
Upper deck
 - b. Employees – Area directly outside kitchen door

SWIMMING POOL RULES

1. Members may at any time invite visitors to use the pool facilities upon payment of pool fees for each guest, provided the visitor is accompanied by or sponsored in writing by a member.
2. Pool members with houseguests or childcare providers may use the pool as members of the family after paying seven guest fees per individual.
3. Guest fees for the use of the pool will be charged to the members account. Cash will not be accepted.
4. In the operation of a private swimming pool there are certain laws of the State of New York which must be observed by the Club, its members and their guests. It is necessary to have some rules, which may appear to be restrictive, but which are necessary to avoid the possibility of serious accidents. The following are repeated herein for your information:
 - a. All persons entering the pool must register.
 - b. All persons using the pool must shower with water immediately prior to entering the pool. This may not be taken at home.
 - c. No one may use the pool that has a contagious disease, fever, cold, cough, skin infection, open cut, wound, inflamed eyes, severe sunburn or is wearing a bandage or band-aid.
 - d. Special attention will be given to people with other physical deficiencies (i.e., weak heart) only if the guard in attendance has been informed of the condition.
 - e. No one shall use the pool unless a lifeguard is in attendance, and the "Pool Open" sign is displayed.
5. Nothing shall be taken into the pool enclosure, which will tend to pollute the water, injure bathers or unduly inconvenience others.
 - a. Oily or greasy sun tan lotions are prohibited as they leave a film on the water that clogs the filtration system.
 - b. No person chewing gum will be allowed in the pool area.
 - c. Absolutely no running, pushing or rough play will be permitted.
6. No one is permitted in the pool unless wearing proper bathing attire. The condition and type of bathing attire is subject to approval of the lifeguard.
7. Persons in bathing attire are permitted only in the immediate vicinity of the pool, and not on the terraces, porches, golf course, putting green, golf

- shop, or elsewhere on the Club premises. Exception: While going to or from locker rooms to private cars, while so engaged, bathers are required to wear a robe and sandals (paper slippers are not permitted). Wet bathing attire may not be carried around the Clubhouse or grounds.
8. Children under 16 years of age are required to use the poolside locker and shower facilities rather than those in the Clubhouse and must provide their own towels. Others may do so if desired.
 9. No stones, china, glassware or other breakable materials are permitted inside the pool enclosure.
 10. Although provisions have been made for the safety of the bathers, the Club assumes no responsibility for the safety of anyone using the pool facilities.
 - a. A child shall not be permitted to use the wading pool unless a parent or guardian is in actual attendance.
 - b. A child unable to swim is not permitted in the main pool at any time unless taking a swimming lesson, or accompanied by a parent or guardian.
 - c. THE LIFEGUARD IS NOT CONSIDERED A "GUARDIAN OR A BABYSITTER".
 11. Personal valuables or other articles may not be left with the lifeguard for safekeeping.
 12. No food or beverages may be brought into the pool area from outside the Club grounds.
 13. Swimming and lifesaving instruction may be obtained by arrangement with the Business Office or the Pool Director.
 14. The lifeguards on duty shall insist upon the swimming pool rules being observed and are permitted no discretion in the matter. Penalty for infraction of any rules will be cause for immediate suspension of swimming privileges for the entire family. The Board of Directors shall grant reinstatement of privileges.
 15. The length of the swimming season, and the hours of operation, shall be determined by the Pool Committee with the approval of the Board of Directors. In general, the Club will endeavor to have these facilities available from mid-June through Labor Day daily, weather permitting.

TENNIS COURT RULES

1. Members may, at any time, invite visitors living outside a 25 mile radius of the Club to use the tennis court facilities provided the visitors are accompanied by, or sponsored in writing by, a member.
2. Guests who are residents within a 25 mile radius of the Club shall not be invited more than two times in any calendar year to use the tennis courts except by vote of the Board of Directors.
3. Tennis shoes and shirts must be worn at all times when playing on the tennis courts.
4. Use of tennis courts is for members and guests of members only.
5. Reservations are on a first come, first serve basis.
 - a. Play should be limited to 90 minutes if other members are waiting.

GOLF COURSE RULES

1. Members may at any time invite guests to use the golf course under the following provisions:
 - a. Guest is accompanied, or sponsored in writing or phone, by a member.
 - i. If the sponsoring member plays in the foursome, regular greens fees will be charged.
 - ii. If sponsoring member does not play in the foursome, an applicable greens fee will be charged.
 - b. There is no conflict with scheduled Club functions.
 - c. Guest is registered at Pro Shop to play with greens fees charged to sponsoring members account.
 - d. Guests who live within a 25 mile radius of the Club shall not use the course more than two times per calendar year, except by vote of the Board of Directors, or when invited by the Tournament Committee for team matches and tournaments. Guests living outside the 25 mile radius shall not use the course more than five times per year except by Board vote or Tournament Committee invitation as stated above.

2. Golf/Waiting Program: Golf Waiting members have the following playing opportunities from April 1st through September 30th:
 - a. Members – 4 Times Per Month
 - b. Spouse/Companion – 4 Times Per Month
 - c. Single Members – 4 Times Per Month
 - d. The following restrictions apply: No play on Wednesdays and no play prior to 1:00 PM on Saturdays and Sundays.

3. Everyone using the Corning Country Club golf facilities will be charged respective fees, i.e., greens fees, cart rentals, etc., with the exception of management personnel who work at Corning Country Club. **THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS TO THIS POLICY.**

4. Activity members will receive two rounds of golf per person per family per season with no greens fees, to be arranged on the off days (Monday or Thursday). Times would be arranged through the Golf Pro. Eligibility for golf would be restricted to the Activity Member and Spouse/Companion.

5. The Board of Directors, upon recommendation of the Golf Committee, and after notice to and hearing with the alleged offender(s), may withdraw

privileges, as a penalty for what, in their opinion, is a gross or willful damaging of golf course property or a willful violation of golf rules.

6. On Mondays the course will be open at 8:00 AM with play restricted to the front nine or back nine until 10:00 AM.
7. Non-Member and unsanctioned Club tournaments are restricted to Monday play only and shall not commence prior to 11:30 AM. The Board of Directors must approve exceptions. Member play is possible on outside tournament days. Control is by the Pro Shop staff. Call in for course availability.
8. Matches of less than four players have no standing on the course at any time and shall concede the right of way to other foursomes. There shall be no matches of more than four players. No singles, twosomes or threesomes will be allowed to start play on Saturday, Sunday and Holidays between 7:00 AM and 11:00 AM unless specifically approved by the Pro Shop staff.
9. In Season Reciprocal Play:
 - a. Charging privileges are available at all of our reciprocal clubs.
 - b. Reciprocal members must show membership card prior to charging.
 - c. No reciprocal play allowed at CCC on Wednesdays.
 - d. No reciprocal play at CCC on Saturdays prior to 12:00 PM.
 - e. Reciprocal play at CCC limited on all other days.
10. In Season, the course will be closed for special play as follows:
 - a. Tuesday – 1st Tee will be closed from 8:30 AM to 10:00 AM for Ladies Play.
 - b. Tuesday – Alternating 9 holes from 4:00 PM until dark for the Ladies League.
 - c. Wednesday – Alternating 9 holes until 11:30 AM for the Ladies League.
 - d. Wednesday – 19 holes from 11:30 AM until dark for Men's Play.
 - e. Saturday – Tee times Required from 7:00 AM to 4:00 PM
 - f. Sunday – Tee times Required from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM
11. Children of members may use the course with the following provisions:
 - a. Ages under 16 must have a golf card from the Pro to play alone. They may play on weekdays, but are restricted until

- 1:00 PM on Saturdays and Sundays, even when accompanied by an adult at the discretion of the Pro Shop.
- b. An adult must accompany all children who are beginners until they keep up with the speed of play and observe the rules.
 - c. Children under 12 years of age must be with an adult to play after 1:00 PM and must have a golf card or be with an adult to use the putting green.
 - d. Ages 16 and under will be ineligible to join any Club-sponsored golf league or play in any Club-sponsored tournaments with the exception of : Club Championship (Championship flight only), Keating Cup Tournament, Invitational Best Ball Tournament, Parent/Child Tournament and the Florrie Keating Tournament.
 - e. Children who are NOT Golf Cardholders must be supervised by an adult at all times to avoid action detrimental to other members play or the golf course itself. Young children in car seats or strollers are not permitted on the playing areas of the golf course at any time because of dangers present and their inability to understand these dangers. Children will not be left unattended in any golf cart. Failure to supervise children on the golf course will result in action by the Board of Directors toward the responsible member.
12. Playing areas of the golf course are defined as all tees, greens and fairways including the first cut of rough. Playing areas also include all of Holes #9, #12, #16, #17 and the areas between #10 and #14, #12 and #13, #1 and #18, which are blind landing areas.
13. Specific ground rules for play shall be printed on scorecards. Any rules not specifically covered shall be in accordance with U.S.G.A rules. A copy of the U.S.G.A. rules is available in the Pro Shop.
14. Play must start on hole #1 unless there is permission from the Pro.
15. Players must register at the Pro Shop prior to play.
16. Slow matches must encourage faster matches to play through, especially if there is open space ahead. No player shall play more than one ball at a time.
17. Pull carts must be kept off the approaches to greens and tees as well as the greens and tees themselves.

18. All Club sanctioned tournaments shall be open to both women and men members. Spouses, Board approved Companion Members and Dependents of members shall be allowed to play in tournaments if, in fact, the field is not full providing the dependent is a minimum of 16 years of age.
19. Do not hit practice balls off tees and fairways nor onto greens.
20. Do not kneel or sit on greens.
21. Repair ball marks, replace divots and rake traps after using.
22. Free drops are to be taken away from small trees (two club lengths or shorter) and do not break branches off any trees or bushes.
23. Do not walk near the cup, and carefully remove and replace the pin.
24. Players or their caddies will not enter the pond on holes #10 or #14.
25. Tee-off only between tee markers with mulligans not allowed.
26. On Saturdays and Holidays tee-off times will be in effect from 7:00 AM until approximately 4:00 PM and on Sunday from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM. All tee times are available by calling the Pro Shop two days in advance and are restricted to one call per foursome.
27. At anytime the course, or portions of the course, can be closed by the Greens Superintendent, Golf Pro, Vice-President of Golf, or their designates, if it is felt play will damage the course. The use of power golf carts may also be restricted due to course or weather conditions.

GOLF SEASON POLICIES

1. Green Opening -
Greens will open on or about April 1st dependent on weather and course conditions. The day-to-day decision will be left to the Greens Superintendent and the Golf Pro.

2. Green Closing -
Greens will close on or about December 15 unless weather conditions (snow or frost) dictate an earlier closing date. Weather permitting, greens may remain open beyond December 15th. The day-to-day decision will be left to the Greens Superintendent and the Golf Pro.

3. Open Play -
The course will be open for unrestricted member play prior to the beginning and upon completion of the Tuesday and Wednesday League play. This should occur prior to May 1st and on or after October 1st.

4. Termination of Weekend Tee Times -
Tee times will not be required for weekend play prior to May 1st or after October 1st.

5. Driving Range -
The driving range will open on April 1st, weather permitting and close on November 1st.

POWER GOLF CART RULES

1. All carts must be signed out at the Pro Shop prior to use.
2. The age limit to operate a powered golf cart is 15 years of age.
3. Powered golf carts are to be operated as follows:
 - a. On cart paths, where available. In the rough or fairways except as marked or roped off.
 - b. At a safe and prudent speed.
 - c. No closer than 30 feet to any green, no closer than 15 feet to any tee and away from wet areas. Obey the signs and lines near the greens and tees.
4. Anyone who rents a golf cart will be held liable for any damage to the cart while rented.

PERPETUAL HOLE-IN-ONE INSURANCE FUND

1. The purpose of this fund is to provide money to celebrate a Hole In One.
2. This fund may also apply to Hole-In-Ones made at other clubs, but shall be limited to a maximum of \$200. A call to the Business Office or Pro Shop must be made informing the Club of the Hole-In-One. At the time of a call if the golfer desires to spend the remainder of the fund at the CCC Club he or she must schedule the day for the remainder fund to be spent. This must be as soon as the member returns to the club. The fund must be spent within the same golf season. The member must bring a receipt for the monies spent at the other club not to exceed \$200.
3. This fund will be available from the "Official" Opening Day in the spring to the "Official" Closing Day in the fall as established at the Corning Country Club.
4. The amount of money in the fund is equal to 3 times the number of Hole-In-One participants.
5. To enroll in this fund a member must request, in writing to the Business Office, that he/she, by name, or any other family member, by name, would like to be enrolled. Each enrolled member will be initially charged \$3 and whenever any fund member has a Hole-In-One, each participating members account will be automatically billed another \$3. All billings are done by the Club Business Office to the member's monthly account.
6. The Business Office will place a list of all current Hole-In-One participants in the lobby to the Grill Room.
7. Withdrawal from the Club must be done in writing to the Business Office, again stating each individual's name withdrawing.
8. When a Hole-In-One occurs, the bartender is responsible to insure the fund amount is not exceeded unless specifically instructed to do so from the member who will then be responsible for the added charges.
9. The fund is to be used on the day of the Hole-In-One, but can be used on a future day with the agreement of the member scoring the hole-in-one, the Club Manager or the Club President.
10. Hole-In-Ones must be verified by at least one accompanying player and at least 9 holes must be played. Holes-in-one at other clubs must also be acknowledged by the other club Pro or Official.

11. Any fund money that is not spent when the Hole-In-One occurs will be transferred to the Golf Course Capital Improvement Fund.
12. All drinks must be consumed at the Club.

RECIPROCAL CLUB ARRANGEMENTS

1. Arrangements have been made with out of town Clubs, as listed on the back side of your membership card, to permit Corning Country Club members, upon presentation of their membership card, to enjoy golfing privileges, up to five times per year, without payment of greens fees on weekdays except Holidays. House privileges are extended at all times except when special events are scheduled.
2. Information regarding arrangements for weekend and Holiday play is available at the Pro Shop.
3. Members are encouraged to have the Club Pro call the reciprocal club in advance to insure course or dining availability.
4. Arrangements can normally be made to play at the Kenwood Golf and Country Club by advance contact through our Club Secretary. Two weeks advance notice is usually sufficient, and greens fees are required in some cases.
5. In addition to the reciprocal clubs listed on the back of the membership card, during the Invitational Best Ball Tournament, LPGA Week and the Annual Ryder Cup, reciprocal play is available at Elmira Country Club. Again, advance contact is recommended.
6. When reciprocal clubs use Corning Country Club, the rental of powered golf carts by the reciprocal member(s) is required at all times, and greens fees will be charged for Saturday, Sunday and Holiday play. All reciprocals must call the Pro Shop in advance to obtain tee times or to insure course availability. It is the Pro Shop's responsibility to restrict reciprocal play due to CCC League, Tournament or other functions.
7. Prior to each golfing season, the Secretary of Corning Country Club will send a letter to each reciprocal Club outlining policy #6 above along with enclosing a current golfing and social calendar and course availability schedule.

MEMBERSHIP POLICIES

Membership shall be divided into classifications described as follows:

GOLF A-1: Golf Membership for individuals 40 years of age or over and includes the member, his/her spouse or companion, and the dependent children of either. Dependent children are defined as those living at home or in school up to the age of 21 years, or as can be claimed under the Federal Income Tax Law. Full Golf and House privileges apply.

GOLF A-2: Same as Golf A-1 only for individuals under the age of 40. Persons joining this category will not be assessed an additional initiation fee as member passes age limit and enters a different golf classification.

Golf B-2: Golf Membership for single members over 40 years of age.

GOLF Dual/Elmira: For a family, currently a member of Elmira Country Club, and applying for membership at Corning Country Club as a secondary membership. Dues will be less than existing Golf A-1 dues.

Non-Resident: Full Golf A-1 and House privileges. The non resident must permanently reside outside a 50 mile radius of Corning. Dues will be less than existing Golf A-1 dues and initiation fee will be one-half of the current rate.

Golf Waiting: If the Board of Directors has determined that the Club has attained the optimum number of golf members, it may continue to accept applications for Golf memberships. Any person, whose application for a Golf membership is accepted at the time when there are no open Golf memberships available, shall be required to join the Club as a House/Activities/Waiting member. At the time he or she joins the Club as a House/Activities/Waiting member, his or her golf initiation fee shall be fixed at the current level for the Golf membership into which he or she is seeking admission, and he or she shall pay the initiation fee amount of the then current initiation fee for the Golf membership into which he or she is seeking admission. A House/Activities/Waiting member shall have all privileges and obligations of a House/Activities/Waiting member, until such time as he or she becomes a Golf member.

Corporate Golf: This is a transferable Golf Membership for individuals working at the same Corporation. First person pays 125% of the current golf initiation fee. Second person pays 100% of initiation fee, third person pays 75% and fourth person and all others pay 50% of the fee.

Memberships are in the individual name and they pay all current dues. If a person is being relocated for business reasons, their Corporate Membership can be transferred to another member of their Company for a \$500 transfer fee and this must occur within 3 months of the employment change.

House/Activities/Family: House Activity memberships include the member, his/her spouse or companion, and the dependent children of either. Dependent children are defined as those living at home or in school up to the age of 21 years, or as can be claimed under the Federal Income Tax Law. Each family member is allowed two rounds of golf in a calendar year. Full House privileges apply as well as unlimited use of the pool, tennis and exercise facility.

House/Social/Family: House Social memberships include the member, his/her spouse or companion, and the dependent children of either. Same rules apply regarding dependent children as in the House/Activities/Family membership. Only restaurant privileges will apply.

Business/Social: This allows for six (6) people from the same Company to join under current social initiation fee. Each person only has access to the restaurant and banquet facilities. There are no golf privileges with this membership. The monthly dues are equivalent to one social member and no food assessment is incurred. The six individuals can be replaced at no additional fees.
